U.S. Bishops Hail Administration's Action on Religious Freedom

On Oct. 6, the Trump Administration announced plans to provide a broad religious and moral exemption from the Health and Human Services mandate requiring health insurance coverage of sterilization, contraception, and drugs and devices that may cause abortions. The Little Sisters of the Poor have been the lead litigants in court cases objecting to this mandate as a violation of their religious freedom because it goes against their conscience to provide these types of drugs.

Cardinal Daniel N. DiNardo, archbishop of Galveston-Houston and president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the bishops' ad hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, released this joint statement in response:

"The Administration's decision to provide a broad religious and moral exemption to the HHS mandate recognizes that the full range of faith-based and mission-driven organizations, as well as the people who run them, have deeply held religious and moral beliefs that the law must respect. Such an exemption is no innovation, but instead a return to common sense, long-standing federal practice, and peaceful co-existence between church and state. It corrects an anomalous failure by federal regulators that should never have occurred and should never be repeated.

"These regulations are good news for the Little Sisters of the Poor and others who are challenging the HHS mandate in court. We urge the government to take the next logical step and promptly resolve the litigation that the Supreme Court has urged the parties to settle.

"The regulations are also good news for all Americans. A government mandate that coerces people to make an impossible choice between obeying their consciences and obeying the call to serve the poor is harmful not only to Catholics but to the common good. Religious freedom is a fundamental right for all, so when it is threatened for some, it is threatened for all. We welcome the news that this particular threat to religious freedom has been lifted, and with the encouragement of Pope Francis, we will remain 'vigilant, precisely as good citizens, to preserve and defend that freedom from everything that would threaten or compromise it.' "

A Message from Fr. Tim S. Hickey

Dear Parishioners of St. Jeanne Jugan Parish:

Effective Nov. 1 I will begin service in the Diocese of Dodge City, Kansas. As a native Kansan, this is an opportunity for me to return to a diocese in need of priests and to be closer to my family. I have lived and worked in Connecticut for close to 30 years. Archbishop Blair has approved my transfer, and I have been warmly received by Bishop John Brungardt and the priests.

I would like to thank all the parishioners who responded so generously with their time and interest to the variety of programs we were able to conduct for the parish during my tenure. I am especially indebted to the Evangelization/RCIA committee, all those who helped prepare our young people for confirmation, parishioners who faithfully attended our adult faith formation and Bible study programs, and those who volunteered at the town fair the past two summers, along with so many others.

The Diocese of Dodge City is in the language of the Church, a "mission" diocese, meaning that it has too few priests to serve the faithful. There are fewer than two dozen active duty priests, with a handful of retired priests helping as their schedules allow.

Coupled with that is the geographical size of the diocese; for perspective, the entire state of Connecticut could fit into the Dodge City Diocese. I will be serving three parishes in three communities in the far southwestern corner of the state near the Oklahoma Panhandle: Meade, Fowler and Plains. Of those three, one is comprised almost entirely of Spanish-speaking Catholics, which will be an exciting opportunity for me to use and enhance the Spanish-language skills I learned in seminary.

My last weekend in the parish will be Oct. 21-22. I sincerely appreciate your prayers for my transition to the Dodge City Diocese, and please know you will be remembered in mine.



Welcome

In today's Gospel (Mt 22:1-14) we read that *"He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come."* Why? What made the king's invitation so distasteful to these guests? According to the parable, either the guests were too busy with their farms and their businesses, or else they were downright hostile to the entire idea: they *"laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them."* What could possibly explain this resistance?

Perhaps we have a clue in the puzzling conclusion of today's Gospel. One of the second-string guests pulled in from the streets came to the feast *"not dressed in a wedding garment."* The man knew he was guilty, hence his silence. And the king's punishment suggests that the fellow ought to have known better. This "wedding garment" calls to mind the preparation of our souls necessary to join in the great *"wedding feast of the Lamb"* (Rv 19:9), that is, heaven. This man was apparently just too lazy to get ready. He presumed that having received an invitation to the banquet was enough, that nothing was required of him. Not so. He should have demonstrated his gratitude by dressing appropriately. And what of the first-string guests? Some were too busy to bother coming; others were furious that they had been invited at all.

Now, where do we fit in? Are we more concerned with worldly work than with spiritual growth? Are we offended by the very suggestion that we might need to "dress up" our souls? Or are we the disinterested Christian, willing to feast but too lazy to foster his faith? Jesus gave his life to open the gates of heaven for us. Let's show our gratitude by preparing radiant, beautiful souls worthy of the heavenly wedding feast.

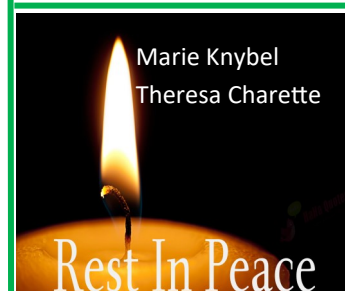
