



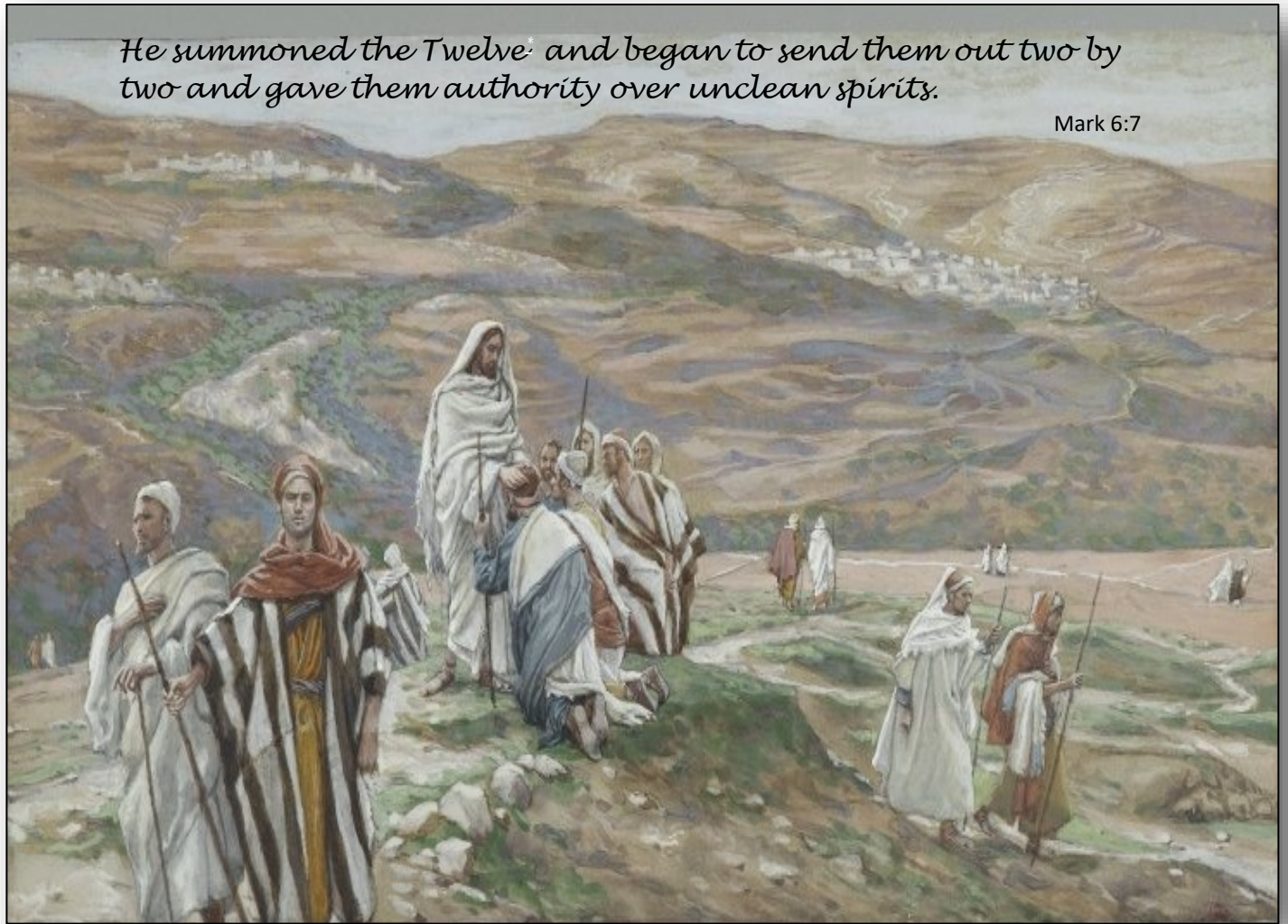

REFLECT

"He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two." This Sunday we read the first sending of the Apostles to preach, teach, and heal. For many of us, it can be easy to think we "just don't have enough" to be disciples and evangelists ourselves. We don't have enough education and training. We don't have enough experience talking to people about Jesus. We don't pray enough. We don't have enough faith.

If you look at the Apostles in today's Gospel reading, they didn't have much either. "No food, no sack, no money in their belts." They didn't plan out their itinerary or book their lodging in advance. From what we know of the Apostles, they were not the religiously trained and educated ones. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. But what does being a fisherman require? Someone like Peter needed a strong work ethic to rise at strange hours. He needed patient calm to wait for the catch. Once ashore, he needed a savvy mind to fetch a good price for his labors.

As Peter became a fisher of men, he would need diligence to persevere through the hard journeys, long days, and persecution that awaited him. He would need patient calm with those who disagreed with him. As the leader of the Apostles, he would need a savvy mind to navigate challenges facing the early Church. From one perspective, Peter has nothing to offer the mission of Jesus. Thinking more creatively, one can see that, joined with faith and love, perhaps Peter had everything he needed.

Jesus sends you as well. As you take stock of your own talents, consider how they might be offered as a gift to others. Maybe you already have more than enough.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. GOLAS:

I would like to commend the committees who have been working on the transition of the Churches and Parish since last fall. The Executive Committee (Frank Camerota, Ken Gorzkowski, Mary Ann Harris, Scott Kinelksi, Alicia Ross, and Kerri Work) has been studying and discussing various aspects of the Churches and Parish and are working on a plan for our Parish. They will benefit greatly from the Merger Transition Committee who has accomplished, in my opinion, a monumental task. The Merger Transition Committee is composed of the following (Michael Arnone, John Berube, Claire Bronson, Sue Cotter, Kristen Fitzsimons, Dave Gagnon, Pat Keck, Ryan Laroche, Bob LeMay, Josh Sullivan, and Kathy Thomson). This committee interviewed all groups, committees, and volunteers regarding all aspects of the Churches. This committee was assisted by members of the subcommittees. Although I do not have all their names, all involved in those efforts have my deepest appreciation and heartfelt thanks. This committee has submitted reports of what is presently taking place in the Parish. They have also included recommendations for improvements to our present operations. I have acted on some of the recommendations. Some recommendations will need further discussion and deliberation before any decision will be made. The past year has seen many changes in the Parish and the Churches. I am very grateful for the level of cooperation and understanding of St. Jeanne Jugan parishioners.

Deacon Ernie Scrivani of the Pastoral Planning office will be conducting a workshop with our committees to assess all areas of Parish life. It is helpful to have outside help to see clearly what is an accurate picture of where we are as a Parish. With the results of this workshop, we will be better able to develop a plan for the future. Your prayers for this undertaking are certainly needed and welcome.

On another note, I have submitted a request to the Archdiocese for permission to replace the roof over Fr. Kerwan Hall at Holy Family Church and the surrounding areas. This was submitted June 20th. I am expecting to receive a reply shortly for this request. The new air conditioning unit for Fr. Kerwan Hall should be operational this week. I commend our Facilities Committee and maintenance staff for all their work with these projects. I hope you all enjoy a restful and peaceful summer.

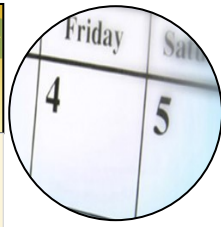

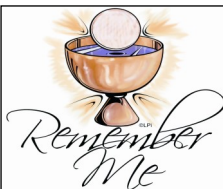
