## REFLECT

As we go about our days, we necessarily label, classify, and prioritize. What's "in" and what's "out" on our priority list? Because humans are social beings, we tend to do the same thing with people. We can only invite six people to the dinner party. Our young child wants to invite certain friends to her birthday, but we're keenly aware of who the parents are, and the prospect of spending several hours with them is enough to give us pause.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' disciples face a classification problem. They've seen another person driving out demons in the name of Jesus. They recognize him, a non-Apostle, as clearly "out." And yet "Jesus replied, 'Do not prevent him . . . whoever is not against us is for us.'" Jesus recognizes real faith in the would-be exorcist. In our own lives, Jesus invites us to recognize others' good intentions. They should not be cut off simply because they do not line up with all our personal preferences. What, then, is deserving of such a fate?

"If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off . . . if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out."

When his listeners blame others, Jesus tends to pivot the conversation to their own lives. In this case, the message is clear. What we really need to cut out is that which keeps us from Jesus. If over-commitment causes us to lose patience with our family, doubt God's providence, and become consumed with self-reliance, cut something out. If certain friendships lead us time after time into gossip and slander, cut it out. In today's Gospel, Jesus invites us to live intentionally in our discipleship.

## TRAVELING ROSARY CONGRESS

The Archdiocese of Hartford is holding a Traveling Rosary Congress from **Saturday, October 6th – Friday, October 12th**. What is a Traveling Rosary Congress? Seven days of around-the-clock Eucharistic Adoration and Hourly Rosary, each 24-hour period hosted at a different church in the Archdiocese, in response to Our Lady of Fatima's call to conversion, consecration and prayer.

The purpose of this Rosary Congress is to recall the message of Our Lady to the three shepherd children in Portugal in 1917, when she appeared to them to request that the faithful pray the Rosary every day, make reparation to her Immaculate Heart for the sins committed against her Son, and pray and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. We wish to respond now to this message.

The Little Sister of the Poor (1365 Enfield Street) will host on Saturday, October 6th with an Opening Mass at 6 pm, followed by Eucharistic Adoration through Sunday, October 7th at 6 pm. During this period there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel, with the Rosary and the Chaplet of Mercy prayed vocally at the start of each hour, followed by silent prayer.

Please consider participating in this special event as we pray in reparation for our families, our Archdiocese, our country, and our world, by volunteering to cover one of the hours of Adoration or stop in to pray for any length of time. Attend on your own, with your family, or with a Parish group or ministry. **We have a particular need for Adorers during the overnight hours from Saturday at 11 pm – 7 am Sunday morning.** To schedule your hour, call Little Sisters of the Poor at 860-741-0791. I appreciate the work of these Committees. Strategic Pastoral Planning will be directed by Deacon Vince and Claire Bronson and members from the subcommittee of the Merger Transition Committee. I will keep you informed of developments. Your prayers, especially to St. Jeanne Jugan, are most welcome and appreciated.

## ST. JEANNE JUGAN PARISH LISTENING SESSION

This is the second of three questions addressed at the St. Jeanne Jugan Parish Listening Session held on August 6, 2018 at St. Bernard Church. The first question was published in the September 23rd bulletin and the last question will be published in the October 7th bulletin.

Sixty-one (61) parishioners from both churches, St. Bernard and Holy Family, expressed their opinions, in writing and through discussion. Trustee Dr. Claire Bronson led this Session at the request of our Pastor, Father Golas.

The invitation for all St. Jeanne Jugan parishioners to express their opinions on the three critical questions posed by the Archdiocesan *Synod* was published six consecutive weeks in our Parish bulletin. An announcement of the Listening Session and the invitation for participation was made at the beginning of each Mass for six consecutive weekends.

The final report has been submitted to our Pastor and to the Archdiocese, as requested.

### QUESTION 2

#### **What are we (as an Archdiocese) doing not so well?**

- Direct contact between the Archbishop and people in each Parish
  - No visits to our Churches other than for Confirmation
- Engaging younger age groups (15-50), teens and adults, in Church activities
  - Not enough youth activities
  - Insufficient continuing education opportunities
- Adult Catechesis
  - Teaching the process a Catholic needs for sharing the “Good News”
  - Not enough sessions, such as Bible study, Mass explanation, Saints, types of sins; Dictionary of Common terms; Church’s changes and Scriptures
  - Providing more Catholic literature in our churches
- Communicating often enough, especially at Mass
  - Videos are popular and “bring” the Archbishop to the people
  - Explanations of the Pope’s announcements on doctrine
  - Informing parishioners as to the plans for our future as a Church; additional information would alleviate speculation and uncertainty
  - Let general public know about outreach of Catholic Charities to those in need, helping to counteract all the negative press
- Being proactive in identifying, helping, and combining struggling Catholic schools
  - More diocesan scholarships; more direct funding to schools
  - Increase salary for teachers
- Transparency and clarity on the “tough” issues
  - Religious scandals
  - Homosexuality
  - Reasons behind teachings on marriage, sex, relationships
- Attracting more priests and deacons
- Transferring priests
  - Some stay at a parish for a long time; some parishes have a revolving door
  - Let people know why a change is being made
- Allowing the Annual Appeal season to run too long
  - Funds for the Donors Dinner could be used to support the charities, rather than the donors

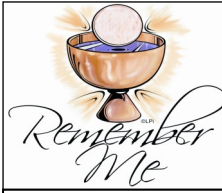
