## LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

**W**ay back in 1959, when Pope (now St.) John XXIII was only in the third month of his papacy, he called for a Church council, a gathering of all the Church’s cardinals, leading theologians and others to discuss how the Church could proclaim Christ’s timeless message in a world and culture which was even then growing increasingly hostile to faith and morals.

The Second Vatican Council was launched and its chief goals weren’t to do away with the Latin Mass or have the priest turn his back on the tabernacle when offering Mass, though that’s all some people think got accomplished. The goal of Vatican II was to re-propose to a world in darkness that Christ is the light of the nations and that the Catholic Church founded by Jesus Christ is the standard bearer of that light to the world. Therefore, the Church’s constant aim — as it has been since her founding — is to share that Light with the world; in other words, to *evangelize*.

For most of us, “evangelization” is a strange-sounding word. It’s Greek for “good news.” When the Greek army won an important battle, the general would send a herald back to the king announcing the victory, the “*evangelion*.”

The same term appears in the New Testament. Jesus stands in the temple and reveals his mission: to “evangelize the poor” (Lk 4:18). After his Ascension, the Apostles continue

Jesus’ mission to “evangelize” (Acts 5:42).

So if evangelization is such a part of who we are, why are we so challenged to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to our family members, to friends and co-workers...even to strangers?

People are spiritually disaffected and disconnected; they’re bored. To paraphrase Venerable Fulton J. Sheen, whose writings and TV shows from the 1950s and ’60s still ring true today, it takes intellectual rigor to be an atheist, someone who says there is no God and makes a strong (though misguided) argument for their belief (or lack thereof). It just takes laziness, however, to hold onto warped or wrong views about God and about Catholicism, and then to persist in holding onto them when the truth is so easily found.

Just as a pitcher sizes up the batter and sends a signal to the catcher about what kind of pitch he’s going to throw, we need to size up the landscape in our parish and our community before launching out with great programs of renewal.

Becoming missionary disciples and fostering the growth of parishes where missionary discipleship drives all parish programs and initiatives is the goal of pastoral planning. Pope Benedict XVI has said we must “emphasize the missionary character of all pastoral activity.” It won’t happen overnight, but it must indeed happen.



## Welcome

**W**e can trust and follow God even — especially — in difficult times. Today’s First Reading for Respect Life Sunday (Ezekiel 18:25-28) tells us that God is always on the side of life: Following God’s ways can seem difficult at first, but in the end, those who turn away from sin “shall surely live.”

It can be a challenge to form the conscience correctly when the things that are right and just involve hardship and sacrifice. We will have to turn our backs on a lot that the popular culture and society tell us are good for us. We know, however, that our God-given human dignity is not something that can be lost or diminished — regardless of circumstances.

Today’s Gospel (Matthew 21:28-32) challenges us to follow the “way of righteousness.” It is our deeds, not simply our words and good intentions, that count in following Jesus.

We have nothing to fear if we remain humble and open to what God has planned for us...even when we stumble and lose our way.

## The 'culture of encounter'

**POPE FRANCIS KICKS OFF TWO-YEAR GLOBAL CAMPAIGN TO HIGHLIGHT PLIGHT OF REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS**

On Sept. 27 at the Vatican, Pope Francis was scheduled to launch a new international campaign called "Share the Journey" to increase awareness of and create solutions for the estimated 244 million men, women and children who are currently away from their homeland due to war, persecution, economic dislocation or other reasons.

"Share the Journey" is being organized by Caritas Internationalis, a group of more than 160 Catholic relief agencies around the world. Caritas is the global arm of the Catholic Church's relief work and helps to address such problems as poverty, migration, emergencies, hunger and health.

Hartford Archbishop Leonard P. Blair has issued a letter about "Share the Journey" and the role of parishes and individual Catholics in this campaign as it unfolds over the next two years (excerpts follow):

"According to our Holy Father, this public awareness campaign will help to dispel the 'culture of indifference' and promote a 'culture of encounter.' It means seeing through the eyes of others rather than turning a blind eye. In his words: 'Not just to see but to look. Not just to hear but to listen. Not just to meet and pass by, but to stop. And, don't just say, "What a shame, poor people," but allow ourselves to be moved by pity.'

"When I celebrate the customary Respect Life Mass at the Cathedral of St. Joseph on Oct. 8 at 11 am, I will include the message of 'Share the Journey.' "

## From Fr. Golas: Pastoral Planning Update

As we enter the season of autumn, school is under way and our young people have returned to their classes. As a parish, we are continuing to engage in the process of merging Holy Family and St. Bernard into St. Jeanne Jugan Parish.

The merger envisioned by the archdiocese has both churches remaining open with a new parish administrative structure. There will be one parish entity. A new corporation of the parish is being formed with new tax identification. The business managers have been working on this aspect of the merger. There will be one parish council and one finance council for St. Jeanne Jugan Parish to be established.

At recent meetings of both parish and finance councils in both parishes, an Executive Committee (EC) and a Merger Transition Team (MTT) were established as called for by the archdiocese. It was decided to suspend the present parish and finance councils to fully be involved in this process. Members from the suspended councils at both Holy Family and St. Bernard will serve on these new committees. Members of the suspended finance and parish councils not on these committees are being asked to serve on subcommittees addressing various aspects of the merger and parish life.

The EC and MTT will serve as the lay leadership of the parish until the new finance and parish councils can be established. The names of the committee members and the function of each committee will be published soon both in the bulletin and at [www.sjjenfield.org](http://www.sjjenfield.org).

We are involved in a process that affects everyone. I see this as an opportunity to consciously consider parish needs, strengths, weaknesses and the totality of the resources of the parish. From this process, there will be the development of a strategic pastoral plan that will include the following components: Mission, Vision, Objectives, Goals and Guiding Principles.

Your interest and involvement is very necessary in this process. I envision open parish meetings to listen to your concerns and issues. In the meantime, I would be happy to respond to your concerns at any time through the contact information included in the bulletin or on the parish Web site.

As the process is just beginning, there are many aspects to be considered but decisions are to be made in the future. In the meantime, you will notice as much as possible I am trying to maintain the present schedule and operation of both parishes. I know the residents and the Little Sisters of the Poor are praying for this process. Let us add our prayers for God's assistance and guidance moving forward. I pray for God's blessing on our parish, our archdiocese, and our Church in this time of transition.

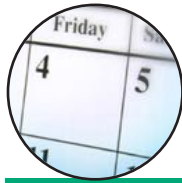

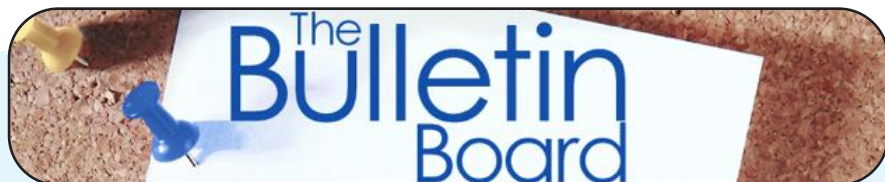
