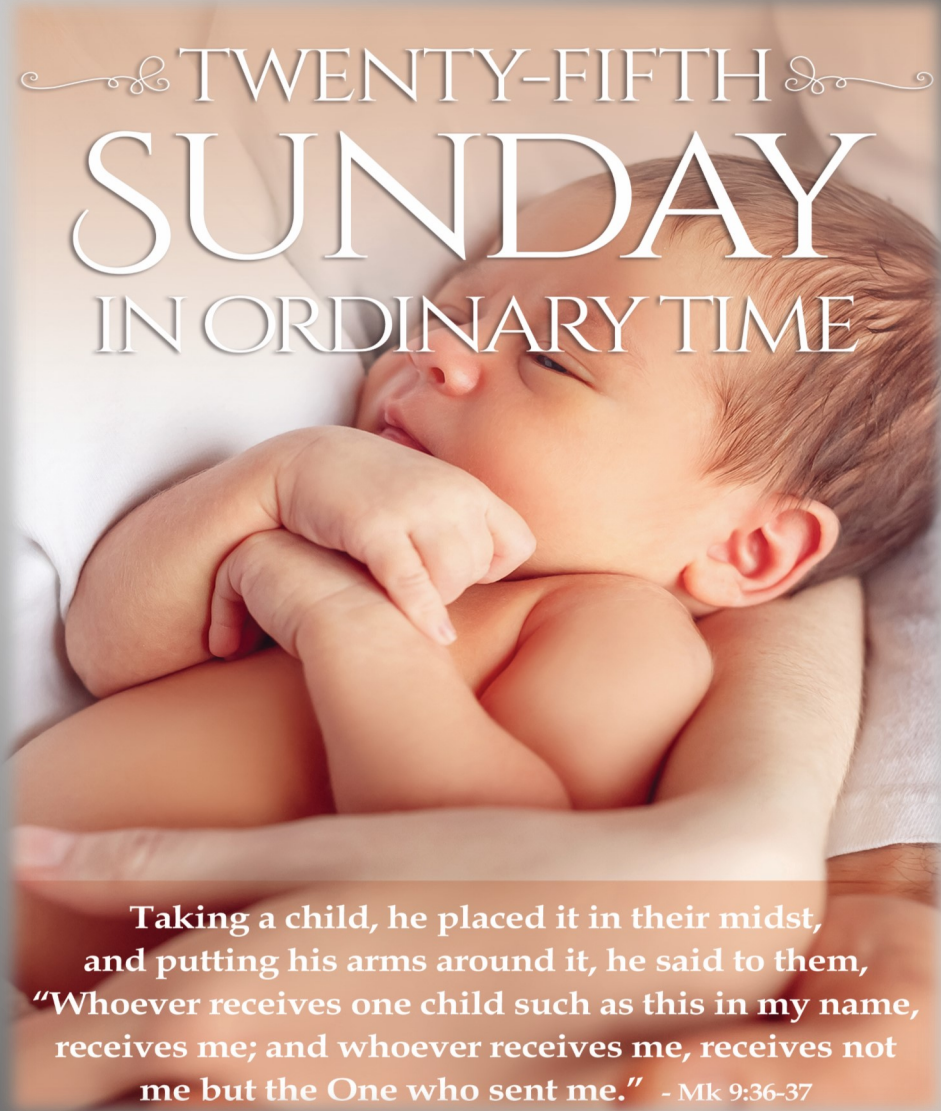

REFLECT

The Oscars. The Super Bowl. TV talent shows. Your child's Little League championship. We live in a culture set on competition. The desire to "be the best" goes beyond hobbies and into politics, the corporate world, and parenting comparisons at the park. This desire is as old as the human race, and it surely arose in Jesus' day. While Biblical society was significantly less open and upwardly mobile than our own, power was attractive. From what we know, many of Jesus' disciples had come from lowly backgrounds. Now they followed an increasingly popular rabbi who seemed primed to do something big.

Jesus does his best to dissuade their high hopes by prophesying his own defeat. "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him." Internalizing the message proves challenging for the disciples, and their attention remains fixed on earthly glory. "They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest." True to style, Jesus flips their pretensions on their heads. "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

We have heard these Biblical principles before. Do we believe them? In our professional lives, do we do whatever we can to get ahead, or are we concerned with the entire team succeeding? In the lives of our children, are we more concerned with victory or with building character? Jesus doesn't condemn success, but he reframes it. "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me." Today's Gospel is a reality check. In God's eyes, our success will not be measured by worldly output alone but by how much love and service we offer to others in the process.

TRAVELING ROSARY CONGRESS

The Archdiocese of Hartford is holding a Traveling Rosary Congress from **Saturday, October 6th – Friday, October 12th**. What is a Traveling Rosary Congress? Seven days of around-the-clock Eucharistic Adoration and Hourly Rosary, each 24-hour period hosted at a different church in the Archdiocese, in response to Our Lady of Fatima's call to conversion, consecration and prayer.

The purpose of this Rosary Congress is to recall the message of Our Lady to the three shepherd children in Portugal in 1917, when she appeared to them to request that the faithful pray the Rosary every day, make reparation to her Immaculate Heart for the sins committed against her Son, and pray and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. We wish to respond now to this message.

The Little Sister of the Poor (1365 Enfield Street) will host on Saturday, October 6th with an Opening Mass at 6 pm, followed by Eucharistic Adoration through Sunday, October 7th at 6 pm. During this period there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel, with the Rosary and the Chaplet of Mercy prayed vocally at the start of each hour, followed by silent prayer.

Please consider participating in this special event as we pray in reparation for our families, our Archdiocese, our country, and our world, by volunteering to cover one of the hours of Adoration or stop in to pray for any length of time. Attend on your own, with your family, or with a Parish group or ministry. **We have a particular need for Adorers during the overnight hours from Saturday at 11 pm – 7 am Sunday morning.** To schedule your hour, call Little Sisters of the Poor at 860-741-0791. FROM FR. GOLAS:

Another season of the year has begun. Classes resume for our students. The Parish schedule has returned to the active phase after the summer hiatus. I want to inform you of some important developments.

The contract to replace the roof over Fr. Kerwan Hall was signed in late August. Allied Roofing has schedule the work to begin in late October or early November of this year.

I am happy to report the hiring of a new coordinator for Youth Ministry. Kristen Fitzsimons was hired part time to lead this critical ministry. Kristen has been involved with this ministry and has done a fine job. Her background in education and her years of involvement in Holy Family Church make her well suited to lead this crucial ministry to our young people. She is assisted by dedicated volunteers and has the support of our Parish staff. I appreciate Kristen's willingness to continue to lead this program.

ST. JEANNE JUGAN PARISH LISTENING SESSION

This is the first of three questions addressed at the St. Jeanne Jugan Parish Listening Session held on August 6, 2018 at St. Bernard Church. The other two questions will be published in subsequent bulletins. Sixty-one (61) parishioners from both churches, St. Bernard and Holy Family, expressed their opinions, in writing and through discussion. Trustee Dr. Claire Bronson led this Session at the request of our Pastor, Father Golas.

The invitation for all St. Jeanne Jugan parishioners to express their opinions on the three critical questions posed by the Archdiocesan *Synod* was published six consecutive weeks in our Parish bulletin. An announcement of the Listening Session and the invitation for participation was made at the beginning of each Mass for six consecutive weekends.

The final report has been submitted to our Pastor and to the Archdiocese, as requested.

QUESTION 1

What are we (as an Archdiocese) doing well?

- Taking great care of the poor, needy, and elderly (e.g. Malta Van)
 - Outreach and funding made possible by the Archbishop's Annual Appeal
 - ◆ Annual message from the Archbishop explains the Appeal
 - ◆ Identity of the funding recipients (e.g. Little Angels School) is publicized
- Taking leadership in the reorganization of all parishes
 - Recognition of the changing dynamics of church participation and finances
 - Realization of the priest shortage and sharing priests among the parishes
 - Permission for each parish to proceed at a pace consistent with its culture and existing activities
- Communicating changes, activities, success of programs, appointments, etc.
 - Multi-media use to reach many audiences
 - ◆ Archdiocesan Website is very useful
 - ◆ Catholic Transcript includes many aspects of life in our diocese
 - ◆ Other media such as My Parish /app.
 - ◆ Radio station WJMJ
- Providing accessibility to learn more about and practice of our Faith
 - Promotion of Confession at all Churches during Lent/Advent
 - Community Outreach programs
 - Workshops and programs around the diocese

This weekend, **September 22nd and 23rd**, we will have a second collection for HOPES.

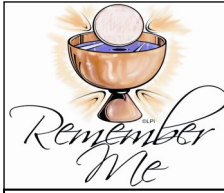
- The HOPES Collection benefits the Catholic elementary schools of the Archdiocese by providing schools with individual HOPES Grants.

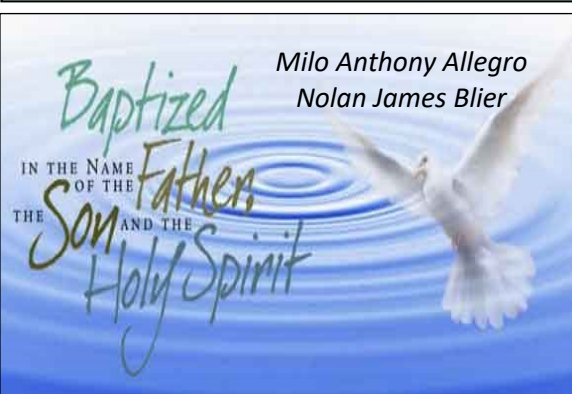
Please leave your food donations in Fr. Kerwan Hall or in the vestibule at Holy Family Church. Lockboxes will be available for monetary donations.
