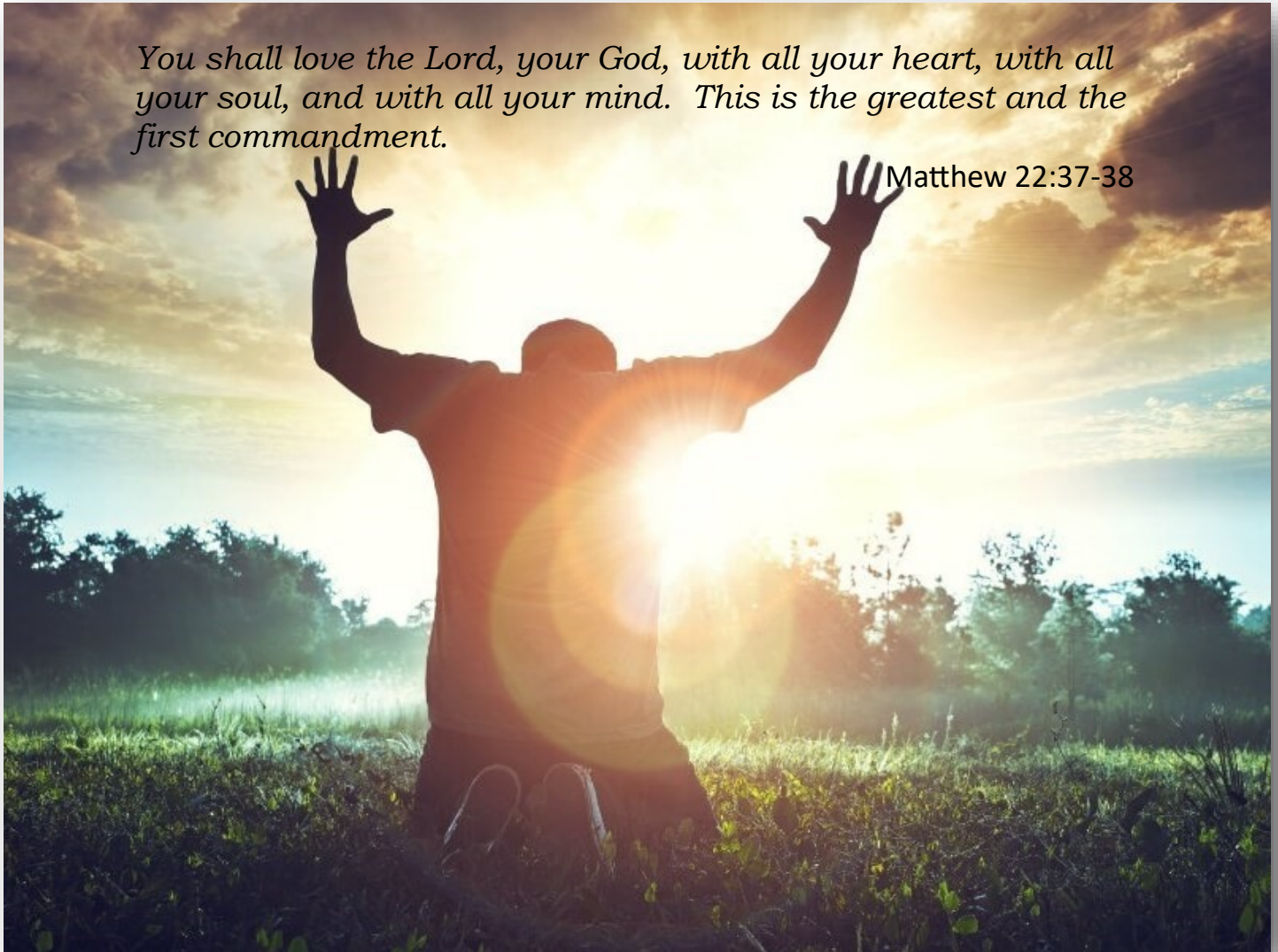

GOD'S PRESENCE IS IN ALL CREATION

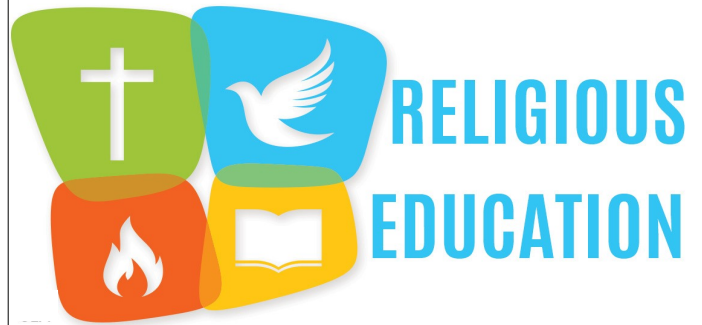
REFLECT

For some reason, it is easier to genuflect in reverence to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle of a church, than to genuflect in reverence to the same presence of Christ in another person's soul. We wrongly believe that God divides himself, placing himself in one place in preference to another. It doesn't work that way. Love of God and love of neighbor are intimately and inseparably connected because the essence and spark of God's very presence is in all creation. God's presence is just as real in the one who is good, as in the one who is bad, and the one who is just, and the one who is unjust.

Our brains get in the way of truly contemplating the awesomeness of this truth. We like to separate things into boxes, the sheep from the goats and the deserving from the undeserving. But, with God there are no distinctions such as this. Our human classifications, subdivisions, and definitions hold no power or have any weight in God's eyes. Sadly, we relate to God and to each other as if they do.

We cannot be deaf to the world's pain. It is not about having, hoarding, accumulating, acquiring, securing, storing, protecting, owning, claiming, or any of the other human terms we use to distinguish mine from yours. We put so much power in these words and that power, even though we may not always realize it, can cause those words and the distinctions they carry to wound and hurt others. We have the whole order of things wrong, but we are so set on preserving this order that we are absolutely afraid to do it any other way. We go through hoops trying to convince ourselves why the perils of the person seeking a new place to call home are not our perils that we turn our back and justify closing our doors. It makes perfect sense to us. Yet, it makes no sense in terms of our faith. It doesn't square with any of the words found in Sacred Scripture or in any time-tested teaching of the church.

We have it all reversed. We know that we do because when Jesus speaks about such things and the words of the Old Testament prophets ring out again, we start to feel uncomfortable and anxious. What we do, directly or by omission, to one of the least of these little ones we do to God. It is quite possible that some of what we are doing personally, economically, politically, globally, and even religiously is doing more harm than good. Let's ponder that a bit.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR THE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM 2020-2021

We are asking to partner with you, the parents of our parish children, to come together and teach the children in a team effort. We promise to be there every step of the way and journey with you through our Catholic faith which is rich in Christian teaching, scripture, history, and tradition.

- **Grade K-8** will be homeschooled using the Loyola Press textbook, with catechist involvement and parish support. Monthly K-8 Parent Meetings will be required for only a half-hour on a Thursday evening at Holy Family Church to pick up materials and lesson plans for the coming four weeks of lessons.
- **Grade 2** will only meet at St. Bernard Church the first Saturday of each month for sacramental preparation with their classroom teacher, as well as continued homeschool lessons with parents.
- **Grade 9** will be meeting in person at St. Bernard Church on Sunday evenings starting in October 2020.
- **Grade 10** will follow the schedule that was mailed home to the incoming Confirmation Class of 2020.

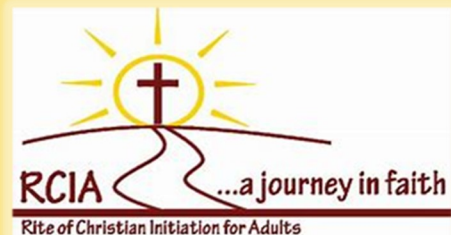
****Please note if you choose not to homeschool your student this current academic year, it will affect your student's grade placement in their next upcoming year in the Religious Education Program.**

BEATIFICATION OF FATHER MICHAEL MCGIVNEY

Father Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, will be beatified during a special Mass on **Saturday, October 31, 2020** at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford.

Father McGivney, a priest in the St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, founded the Knights of Columbus 138 years ago to enable Catholic men to support one another and their families with spiritual and temporal needs. On May 27, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession, qualifying Father McGivney for beatification.

The miracle recognized by the Vatican occurred in 2015 and involved a baby, still in utero, with a life-threatening condition that, under most circumstances, could have led to an abortion.

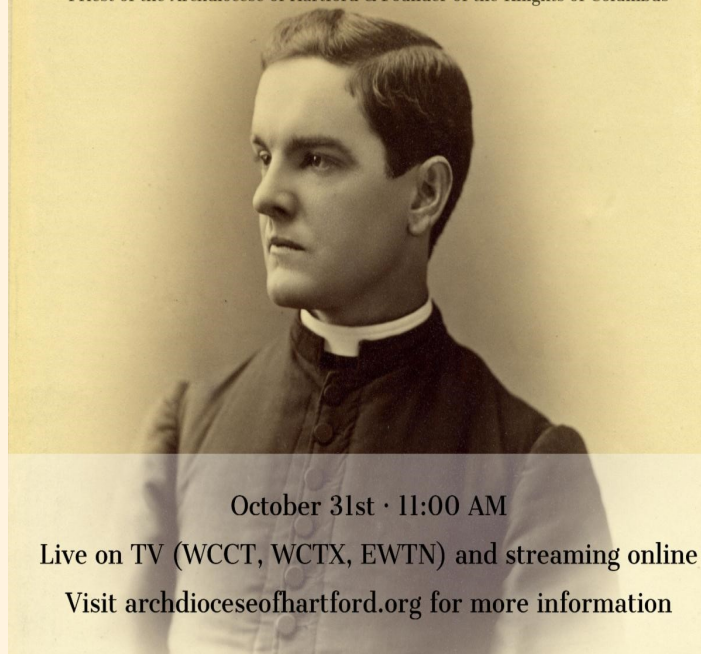
That baby, Mikey Schachle, is now 5 years old. His parents, Dan and Michelle Schachle, of Dickson, Tennessee, prayed to Father McGivney to intercede with God to save their son, still in his mother's womb, who was given no hope of surviving a life-threatening case of fetal hydrops.

Father McGivney, who will be the first American parish priest to be beatified and has long been a hero of working-class Catholics, can be viewed as a martyr of a pandemic. When he died of pneumonia complications at age 38 in 1890, it was during an outbreak of influenza known as the Russian flu in Thomaston, Connecticut.

At Father McGivney's beatification Mass, an apostolic letter from the Holy Father will be read along with the bestowing of the title "Blessed" on Father McGivney. This is the step just prior to sainthood. An additional miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession will be required for his canonization as a saint.

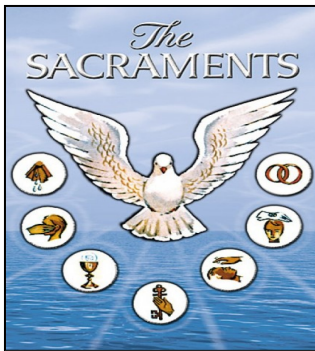

BIRTH OF A SAINT

Birthdays are always a special occasion, but for the Little Sisters of the Poor and the parishioners of St. Jeanne Jugan Parish, today is even more special. For on October 25, 1792, Jeanne Jugan, future saint and foundress of the Little Sisters of the Poor, was born in the French region of Brittany during the French Revolution to Joseph and Marie Jugan. Political strife, religious upheaval, persecution of Catholics, and the loss of her father when she was only four years old shaped Jeanne's early life.

As she matured, Jeanne began finding her passion in working with the poor and the sick. She turned down multiple marriage proposals, telling her mother that God had other plans for her. And how right she was!

Thanks to her strong faith, love for others, and strong-willed desire to help the destitute elderly, she founded the Little Sisters of the Poor.

St. Jeanne Jugan passed away at the age of 86. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on October 3, 1982 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009.

During her canonization Pope Benedict XVI expressed, "In the Beatitudes, Jeanne Jugan found the source of the spirit of hospitality and fraternal love, founded on unlimited trust in Providence, which illuminated her whole life."

WEEKEND MASSES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

Parishes are open for the public celebration of **weekend** Masses, provided that no more than a total of 200 socially distanced persons are present at a given Mass in keeping with the updated limitation set by the State of Connecticut, which went into effect on October 8th. All previously set requirements will still be observed during both weekday and weekend Masses. This includes the wearing of masks while in church and the limitation on singing, which may be done by a cantor but will not include participation by the congregation.

The **dispensation from the Sunday obligation** granted to all Catholics of the Archdiocese of Hartford by Archbishop Leonard P. Blair extends through **Saturday, November 28th**. The elderly, the sick, those who care for someone who is vulnerable, or those who are fearful or anxious are encouraged not to attend or feel obligated to attend at this time.

Live-streamed Masses, both daily and weekend, will continue on our website (sjjenfield.org) so that those who cannot attend will be able to participate and remain connected with the parish.

If you decide to attend Mass, please be charitable by protecting others and yourself. Please read and follow the guidelines below.

- **If you or someone in your household is ill, especially with fever or flu-like symptoms or conjunctivitis, please do not enter the church.**
- **At all times, including entering and exiting the church, practice social distancing by staying at least 6 feet from people who do not live in your household.**
- **You must wear a face mask or cloth face covering. The proper way to wear the mask effectively is to have the mask cover both your nose and mouth.**
- **Do not shake hands with others.**
- **Use hand sanitizers.**
- **Do not congregate to socialize before or after Mass.**
